

SBCSELPA SEAM Notes 5-15-20

- SELPA PSW will be revisited via committee
- CDE allows districts to push pause on initial referrals and treat it as a summer break. – it is up to the district (some parents may try to litigate, etc.)
 - Resources: Inspire Charter Program, ABC Mouse, Etc.
- Special Education Finance Update – actually increased to \$645 per ADA – it has changed to looking at each district within the SELPA and do a 3 year average
 - There will be cash flow issues – June apportionment will be pushed out to next year by sending in July
 - County will be holding a meeting _____; encourage CBO's to go
 - LCFF 10% cut
 - Kim and Ray will do a workshop for District Admn. on SELPA finances and talk about *Maintenance of Effort*
- Cherylin Lew is the new Goleta Assistant Supt. of Student Services – comes from Pasadena; was a school psych and admn. experience
- **There will be a SEAM meeting in June**
- SBCEO is forming a work group made up of superintendents; facilitated by Susan Salcido to look at the reopening of schools; Ray is on the work group; a draft will be provided by end of May on what re-opening will look like; then end of June final plan
- Ray is proposing to have legal guidance to SEAM meetings in the future – there will be a cost
- Kristin Wright from CDE is resigning as of June 1. She is taking on a new position with the Sacramento Office of Education. In interim Shiyo will be Assistant SPED Director; Jack Brimhall will also be taking on
- **SIRAS – electronic signature is now available on AP and Signature Page, link to draft IEP, Parent Rights are an option to go out with IEP Notice (see handout)**
- Jennifer checked out whether or not SEIS docs could remain – they indicated it must be district level; it would be selpa-wide access. It would be \$6,000. It was agreed that the remaining SIRAS training funds held at the SELPA level would be used to keep SEIS files accessible one more year
- Prof. Dev. Reviewed – many are attending the behavior trainings on Fridays and SELPA has gotten great feedback; CPI will continue with other options for certification without being in person explored;
- SBCSELPA will be hiring an Assistive Technology Specialist that will be funded “pay as you go”. A cost of \$3,000 per LEA or per report was mentioned. The form process and form is attached.
