Based on the multiyear projections and assumptions provided by the district, it appears that the district will be able to meet its financial obligations for the current and two subsequent fiscal years while maintaining the required minimum level Reserve for Economic Uncertainties (REU). We therefore concur with the district's positive certification. Your District Financial Advisor will share technical recommendations, if any, with your district's business office. ### **Deficit Spending**

While the district expects to maintain adequate reserves for the current year, the district's budget shows deficit spending in the two subsequent years. In its narrative, the district notes that as a conservative measure, charter oversight fees are not budgeted until received. We encourage the district to continue its cautious forecasting of future revenues and expenses, and update its budget projections as new information becomes available. The district must continue to proactively manage staffing levels, escalating costs, and facilities needs to ensure that adequate ongoing funding remains available to support its core programs and fund activities in the Local Control and Accountability Plan.

### Cashflow

The district's cash flow projections indicate that the general fund will maintain a positive balance throughout the year. Please notify our office immediately if a cash shortfall is projected that cannot be covered through local means (i.e., interfund borrowing).

### Conclusion

We are aware that the information provided reflects the district's financial position and assumptions as of a point in time and that further adjustments will be made during the year as additional data becomes available.

### **Executive Director:**

- Interest forms continue to come in... Coordinators are processing them to place on rosters for 2023-24. Morro Bay is nearly full with a kindergarten lottery held for fewer openings than submissions. Orcutt Middle School is full at this time.
- Graduation 2023 is in the works with up to 64 seniors celebrating on Thursday, June 8th, 5:00pm. Save the date...it's great to have as many board members there as possible.
- The first Senior Celebration event is scheduled for a first at the Rancho Bowl the day before graduation.
- Prom offered to 9-12 students is June 1st in partnership with Trivium.
- The Committees this year have accomplished much together to benefit FPCS and our community.

### **Principal:**

- I am happy to announce that we now have a total of fifteen new members to welcome into our school's California Scholarship Federation chapter. All fifteen students demonstrated academic excellence during semester one.
- In February, all students participated in our writing benchmark assessment by completing a narrative or argumentative essay in response to a prompt. The purpose of the assessment was to identify strengths and challenges in our students' writing skills. On March 13 our staff teamed up to grade writing the benchmark assessments and collaborate on how to focus their instruction on areas of challenge.

We will continue to address these areas in our instruction for the remainder of this academic year and into next year. In the fall we will implement another benchmark assessment, compare our results, and continue to adjust our instruction to meet areas of need.

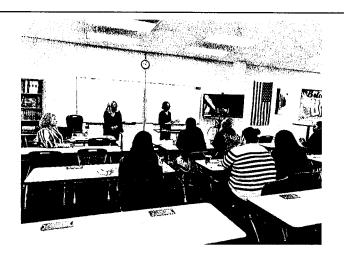

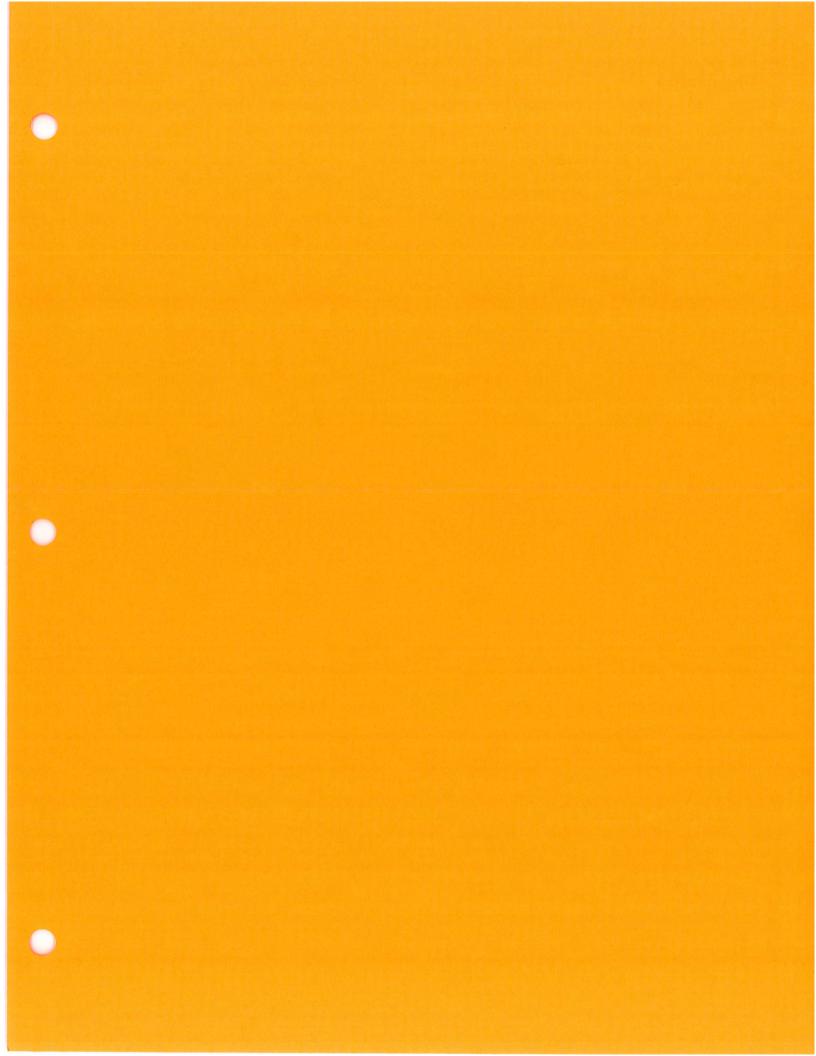

#### CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT

This Contract of Employment is entered into by the Governing Board of the Blochman Union School District ("District") of Santa Barbara County, California and Samuel Orozco ("Special Education Director/School Psychologist").

The parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Employment: District employs Samuel Orozco to serve as Special Education Director/School Psychologist subject to the following terms and conditions.
- 2. Term of Employment: The term of this employment commences July 1, 2023.
- 3. Work Year/Work Hours: Special Education Director/School Psychologist shall work 205 full work days.

- 5. Benefits: Leave for sick time is specifically established at 12 working days per year. Unused sick leave accumulates from year to year. The District contribution for health care benefits is \$10,200 per year.
- 6. Duties and Responsibilities: Duties and responsibilities are outlined in the attached Special Education Director/School Psychologist job description.
- 7. Changes in Contract: This Contract may be changed at any time only by written mutual consent of the parties.
- 8. Applicability of Statutes: This Contract is subject to all applicable statutes of the State of California, to the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education, and to the policies and regulations of District, all of which are incorporated in the Contract. This Contract, and all amendments and attachments to it, are public documents.
- 9. Governing Law: This contract is made subject to the laws of the State of California, the lawful rules and regulations of the agencies of the State and those of District, all of which said laws, rules and regulations are by reference hereto incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide you with professional architectural and engineering services for the Benjamin Foxen Elementary Fire Alarm project DSA open items. We are pleased to submit this proposal for your review.

#### PROJECT SCOPE DESCRIPTION

- Review DSA archive files & plans
- Attend one (1) remote pre-application meeting with DSA to discuss the outstanding items and options for their mitigation.
- Site Survey (field observation report with applicable photos and comments)
- Investigate/coordinate any applicable outstanding items with previous DSA IOR, in person or remotely.
- Coordinate with engineer in responsible charge to obtain a signed form 6AE.
- Coordinate with IOR Bill Korn to obtain a signed form 6PI.
- Up to two site visits for observations of existing construction and conditions by the responsible design professional for the A/E certification program.
- Identification and documentation of non-compliant areas and how they have been or will be resolved/mitigated.
- Define scope of work (referencing the drawings) for a contractor to complete if required.
- At the conclusion of the post-construction evaluation program, submit form DSA 314: A/E Certification Program Verified Report for DSA to examine for project certification

#### **EXCLUSIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS**

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE BLOCHMAN UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT APPROVING THE GUARANTEED MAXIMUM PRICE FOR THE BENJAMIN FOXEN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL MUR AND SCHOOL RENOVATION PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Blochman Union School District ("District") plans to construct the Benjamin Foxen Elementary School MUR and School Renovation Project ("Project") utilizing the lease-leaseback construction delivery method, whereby the District will lease a site that it owns to a contractor who will construct improvements thereon and lease the project and the underlying site back to the District; and

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 17406 authorizes the governing board of a school district to let to any person, firm or corporation any real property belonging to the District if the instrument by which the property is let requires the lessee therein to construct on the demised premises, or provide for the construction thereon of, a building or buildings for the use of the school district during the term of the lease, and provides that title to that building shall vest in the school district at the expiration of that term; and

WHEREAS, the award of any lease-leaseback contract pursuant to Education Code section 17406 is to be based on a competitive solicitation process to the proposer providing the "best value" to the school district, taking into consideration the proposer's demonstrated competence and professional qualifications necessary for the satisfactory performance of the services required; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 17406(b)(1), "best value" means a competitive procurement process whereby the selected proposer is selected on the basis of objective criteria for evaluating the qualifications of proposers with the resulting selection representing the best combination of price and qualifications; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 18, 2023, the Board of Education approved Diani Building Corp. as the lease-leaseback contractor for the Project and authorized Diani Building Corp. to perform preconstruction services; and

WHEREAS, the Project will be constructed in two Phases. Phase I includes the replacement of the existing acoustical wall and ceiling panels inside the MUR, replace the existing kitchen floor, addition of power outlets in the kitchen, infill the boarded-up windows in the MUR, remove or refinish the MUR interior wood panels, paint interior of the MUR, and infill the opening at the stage, and relocate the hand sink. Phase II includes the replacement of the doors and windows throughout the Project, and exterior painting.

**WHEREAS**, Diani Building Corp. has completed the preconstruction services for Phase I of the Project; and

WHEREAS, in order to construct the Project using the lease-leaseback delivery method, it is necessary that the District enter into a site lease, in which the site will be leased to the Contractor; a sublease which provides for the sublease of the site and the lease of the project by the Contractor back to the District; and a construction services agreement that contains construction provisions with which Contractor shall comply with respect to the construction of the Project.

Design Contingency (included in GMP): \$11,323.00

District's Contingency (outside of the GMP): \$0

- **Section 3.** Phase II. The Phase II work will be performed under a separate Guaranteed Maximum Price and contingencies that will be negotiated between the District and the Contractor.
